



Classics of Christian Spirituality Begins July 25

Sign up online or through the church office

Several people have asked me what gave me the idea for Classics of Christian Spirituality. This will be a ten-week study of some of the most influential Christian writings in history. Each week participants will read 20-25 pages of a classic text. Then they will gather Wednesday evenings 5:30-6:30 in Lower Langill to discuss what they read and how it can help them follow Jesus. The idea came to me one day when I was working late at the church. A shadow filled the door frame, and I looked up to see a man with long hair and a prominent nose. He was strangely dressed in a green cloak with a wide white collar.

“May I help you?” I inquired.

“You are zee pastor, no?” he inquired. He spoke English but with a thick French accent.

“Yes, I am. One of them. Pastor David, senior pastor.”

“Ex-sea-LANT!” His face lit up. “I have been looking for you. I need to speak with you on a matter of zee greatest importance.”

I half expected him to ask for money, though he did not seem to be in need.

“What is it?” I asked.

“There are three kinds of people,” he began. “Some of them know God already. They are happy and reasonable. Others are seeking God, though they have not yet found him. They are unhappy but reasonable. Still others do not know God, and they don’t care. They are both unhappy and unreasonable. I want you to help me strengthen those who know God, guide those who seek God, and wake those who are indifferent to God.”

“I’ve heard that somewhere before,” I replied. “The part about three kinds of people. Where did you get that?”

“I did not get it anywhere.” He said in a defensive tone, as if I had insulted him. “I said it myself.”

“No. I’ve read that someplace... Where was it?”

“Perhaps in my book.”

“You wrote a book? Who are you?”

“I meant to write a book. Alas, I did not finish it. Forgive me. I am Pascal, Blaise Pascal.”

“Blaise Pascal? The 17th century French philosopher and mathematician? Author of the *Pensées*, one of the most famous defenses of the Christian faith? That Blaise Pascal?”

“But of course, mon ami!”

“If you are Pascal, what are you doing here? And how are you speaking English?”

“I am here to enlist you in my cause, and I am speaking English because you don’t understand French.”

“I know I don’t know French, but how do you know English?” He shrugged.

“What is your cause?”

“I told you already! To strengthen those who know God, to guide those who seek him, and to wake those who are indifferent.”

“Yeah, OK. I’m already trying to do those things. That’s kind of what we do here. We are all about being disciples and making disciples of Jesus Christ.” Then I added proudly, “We are an ECO congregation.”

“Ahh, yes! Zee ECO. I weesh we had that in France in my day. Good for you. BUT... you need some help.”

“I’m sure I do. What do you have in mind?”

“What if I and a few of my friends helped you?”

“Who do you mean, and how would you help?”

“What if I assembled an all-star team of the brightest, most passionate believers ever, and we came to lend you a hand? I am thinking of Athanasius, Augustine, Julian of Norwich, and of course, my fellow Frenchman, Jean Calvin. Plus others. If you have any ideas, give me some names. I will see what I can do.”

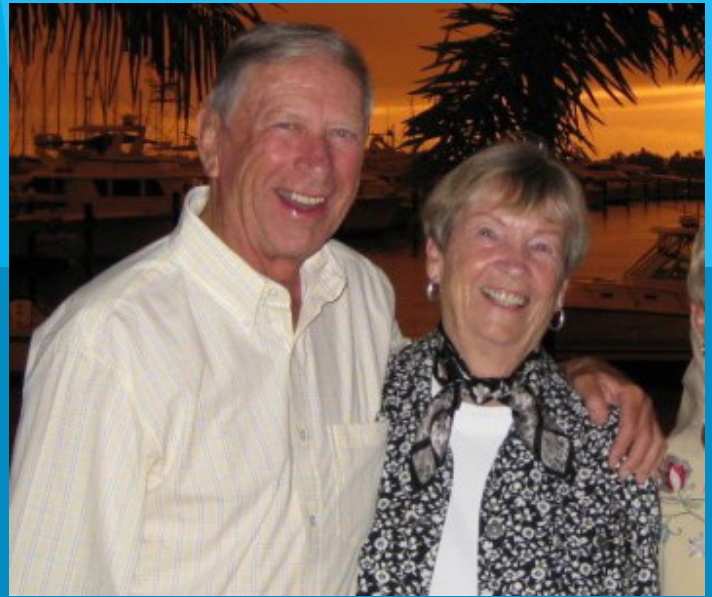
I rubbed my eyes and shook my head. He was still there. I

This program features biblical, Christ-centered teaching that focuses on grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. The DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by a small group discussion about what was viewed. Past participants have related how helpful the information and follow-up discussions were to them.

Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing when friends or family have returned to their daily life routines. Too often people, including Christians, tend to hide their grief instead of allowing it to do the God-given work for which it is intended. Don't allow fear of what others may think to keep you from what could help you. Confidentiality is very much a part of this program.

Your bereavement experience may be recent or not so recent. You will find encouragement, comfort and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member, or friend. No matter what the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in grief and that you do not need to live in bondage to certain emotions. You will learn valuable information about facing your new normal in life and renewing your hope for the future.

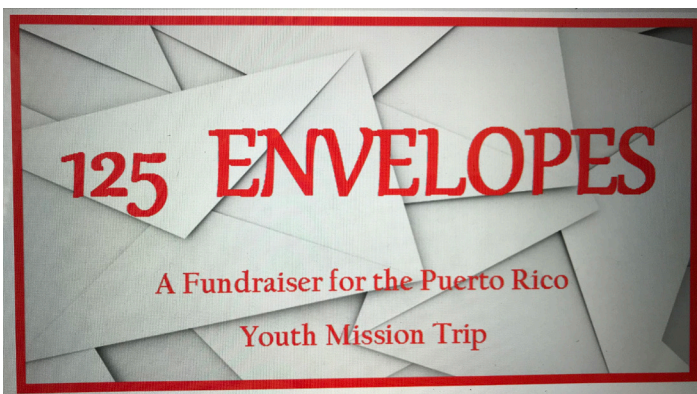
YOUTH NEWS, July 2018

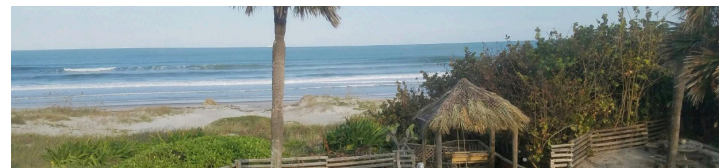

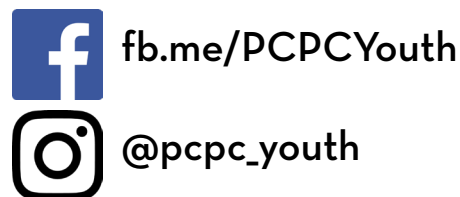

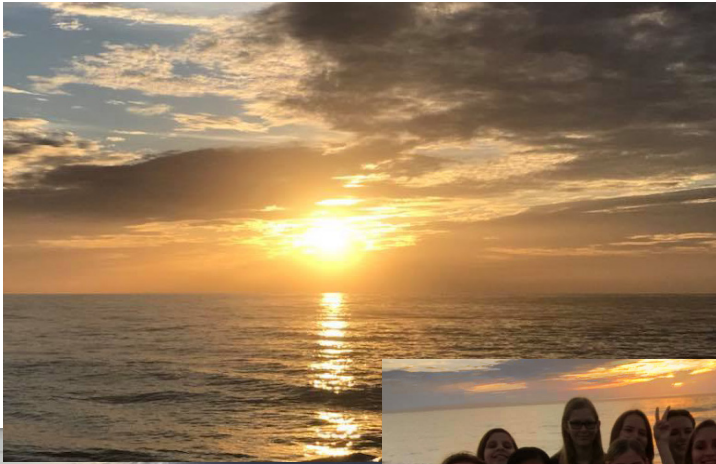

Next they headed to Hallandale Beach, home of a 110 ft. tall Pegasus and dragon statue.

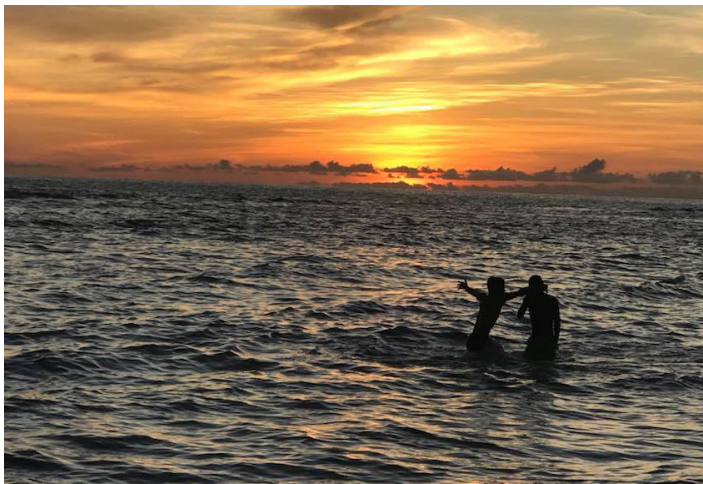

looked dubiously at the empty can of Mountain Dew in the trash. What was happening here? I decided to test him. "How about Dostoevsky? I've always been a big fan."

"Me too!" he exclaimed. "Let's get him."

"How can you like Dostoevsky? You died, like, 200 years before he lived." He shrugged.

I pressed on, "So you guys are going to show up and do what?"

"We are going to share our insight into spiritual matters. We will share our vision, our passion. We will tell what God has done in our lives. We will teach about Jesus, about faith, about prayer."

"You mean like a lecture series?" I was beginning to think this guy was an actor who played all these historical figures. We've had Abraham Lincoln at PCPC. Why not Blaise Pascal? But he quickly set me straight.

"No, no, no." He intoned in that accent, shaking his finger. "We cannot come. We are dead! What a foolish idea. We want to help you, not do your work for you, silly man."

I remembered that Pascal wrote a mathematical treatise on projective geometry when he was only 16 years old. He also developed probability theory and invented the first mechanical adding machine. He was a physicist who made important contributions to our understanding of fluids, pressure, and vacuum. I decided to let the "silly man" comment slide.

"So how are you going to help me?"

"Eez it not obvious? Our writings! You must use our writings! Get people to read them and talk about them. You explain them. Such wisdom! Such treasure! Why don't you use it?"

"Hey!" I said, catching on. "That's not a bad idea. I have found tremendous encouragement and insight reading what those people wrote. Why not share them with others?"

"Yes, you could do a little study. Choose small excerpts that you find especially meaningful. Write a short introduction to each one. Add some study questions. Get people together to discuss them and learn more."

"Do you think people would come?"

"I will wager they would."

"Sweet," I commented. "I've been looking for a fresh new study."

"Now, you have it. The old made new!"

"Thank you, Blaise Pascal. You've given me a good idea. I love what you wrote ..."

Suddenly, I jerked with a start. I lifted my head off my laptop. The left side of my face was waffled where it had pressed against the keys. A tiny puddle of drool pooled near the mousepad. What happened?

Of course! I had fallen asleep. It had all been a dream. I got up and turned to my bookcase. My finger ran along the top shelf until it lighted on a thin little paperback copy of the *Pensées*. I

opened it randomly and let my eye wander down the page. "God

has set up in the Church visible signs to make

Himself known to those who should seek Him sincerely, and that He has nevertheless so disguised them that He will only be perceived by those who seek Him with all their heart."

Yes, some of the readings might be challenging. But they would definitely be rewarding. And the comradery of discussing them with others would be fun. Why not? Why not give it a try?

And so, the Classics of Christian Spirituality study was born. Was that really how it happened?

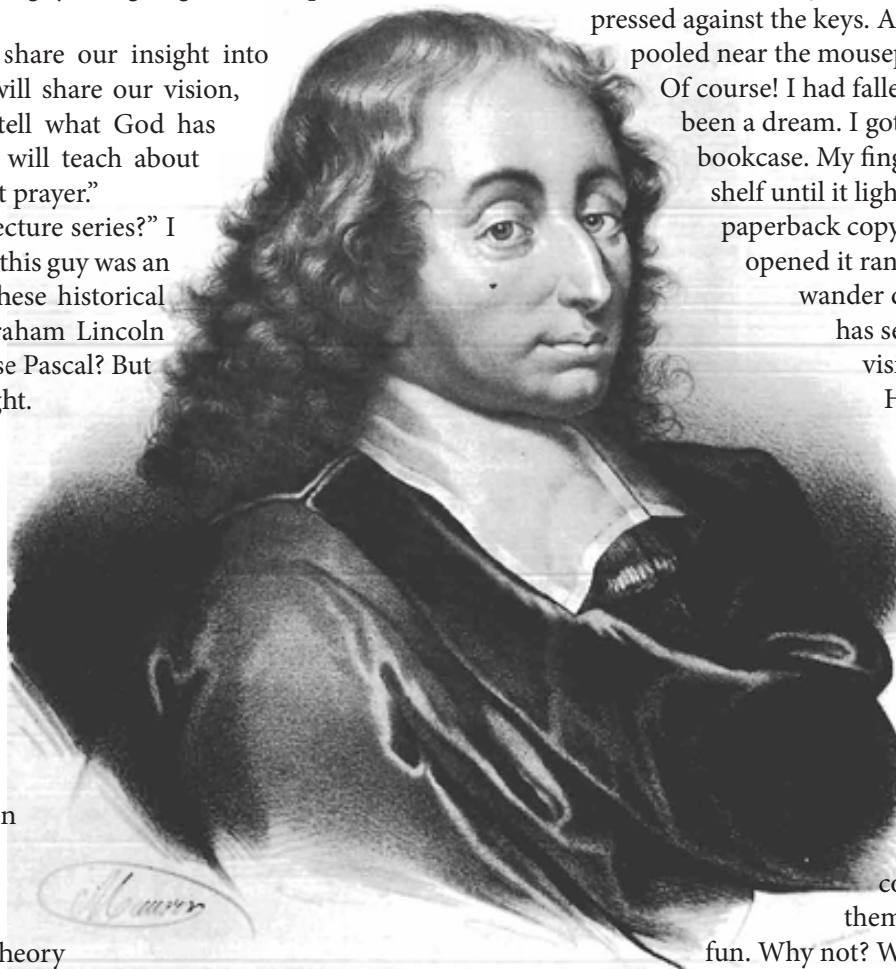
