Sarah, we are delighted that you will be sharing your gifts with us as our Director of Children's Ministry.

Tell our readers about yourself.

I am married to my best friend, and we are blessed with three very active children. Currently, my children are all enrolled at Citrus Grove Elementary. Madeline (11) is a 5th grader and enjoys basketball and art. Emmie (9) is a 3rd grader who enjoys volleyball and music theater. Greyson (5) is finishing VPK and loves T-ball and Taekwondo. My husband, Rob, works for the St. Louis Cardinals front office and is based out of their training complex in Jupiter, which led us to Florida a little over three years ago.

I am a licensed school psychologist and have worked in part-time and full-time capacities since 2005. I did take a few years off to care for my children. I enjoy the beach and being outdoors, traveling with my

family, exercising, and reading. I relish family time at home. I love all seasons and enjoy visiting our extended family up north to soak in some of those seasonal changes, and then returning to our beautiful sunshine!

Tell us about your background. Where did you grow up and go to school?

I grew up in North Carolina in a small town near Greensboro. I received my Bachelor of Arts in Psychology at UNC-Chapel Hill and am a devoted Tarheel fan. I received my Master of Arts and Educational Specialist in School Psychology at the University of Delaware in 2005, and Rob and I married one month after receiving graduate degrees at the same ceremony. 

The marks of true intercession*:


1. A sense of human need

Perhaps you’ve been on an exciting journey, played pretend as a child, have a fantasy world you’ve imagined. Whether you have or not, I would encourage you to pick up *The Chronicles of Narnia* series. Too old for that??? I would challenge that you aren’t. For instance, as a child, I read the most famous of the series, *The Lion, The Witch, and The Wardrobe*, many times. I had not ever been encouraged to read the rest of the series though and hardly knew anything about them. When our daughter picked this series as her read-aloud this year, I was skeptical. Would she enjoy them all? Abigail likes to read a series from the beginning to end, so naturally, we began with book 1: *The Magician’s Nephew*. It was a great read, full of adventure, fantasy, and traditional literary language. What was most intriguing to me was that it told the reader about the beginning of Narnia and the White

Witch and really gave insight to the place we all love from *The Lion, The Witch, and The Wardrobe*. Which, if you haven’t read—go NOW and get it!!! We just finished book 3 last night: *The Horse and His Boy*. This book had quite a different tale from either of the first two.

Abby and I expanded our vocabularies, traveled to new fantastical places, and visited the Narnia we have grown to love this year. The BEST part of this series is that it combines a child’s fantasy world with a rich overlay of Christian philosophy, theming, and characters. The good vs. evil battle runs throughout every story. counselors, and outside agencies to ensure each child had opportunities to reach his or her full potential academically, socially, and emotionally. My work included conducting psychoeducational evaluations, group and individual counseling, crisis response, and helping to develop academic and behavioral interventions. While my work was often challenging in many ways, including emotionally, I found it so fulfilling to make a difference in the lives of children and connect with students on a one-on-one basis. I believe that EVERY child has strengths that can be built upon. Sometimes children just need a positive influence or connection, and I sought out ways to form connections with the students with whom I came into contact.

How did you feel called to this ministry? What convinced you it is right for you?

The Director of Children's Ministry position has been on my heart for some time, and I prayed about and thought about this decision for some time before applying for this role. Children's ministry was at the forefront of our mind each time we visited a new church after relocating to a new area, and I believe that children are the life of the church. I believe making our children's ministry vibrant, exciting, and engaging helps to reach our children in this very busy time of their lives when they are inundated with so many influences on a daily basis. Children need a firm foundation in their faith that they can then build upon as they grow and become more independent, and begin to form that faith and relationship with Christ on their own. I also believe children need a safe place to find support and positive influence as they grow and seek answers to their many questions. As a mom of three children, I understand this important time and



feel passionate about making a difference in the life of each child.

What are some of your goals and dreams?

I would love to add energy and make sure that every child who attends our children's programs feels excited, comfortable, and welcomed. I want each child to leave with ways that they can take what they learned and apply it to real-world situations they encounter each day at school, on the sports field, on the school bus, or at a friend's house. Building a connection with the families of children in our ministry and growing our ministry to draw in others in the community is so important. I would also love to find an additional weekday ministry, to add a way that our children are connected to church during the week and to

ensure that activity is exciting and inviting. Additionally, I want to find ways that our children can participate in and support those in need in our community, so that our children grow and learn that living the Word means to love and reach out to others in need with a true servant's heart.

You and Rob attended the most recent new member class. We are thrilled your family is becoming part of our church family.

What strengths do you see here?

PCPC feels like a warm, inviting congregation for my family. My children feel welcome and comfortable, which is a top priority for my family. We attend the contemporary service, and I love the message each week. It is understandable and consistently applicable to our lives, and I love that our pastor is warm, approachable, and relatable. I love that our church definitely feels that you can come as you are without pretense and that all are welcome.

If you could change one thing about PCPC, what would it be?

PCPC has an amazing foundation in our children's

ministry, and I would love to grow that program. I am so grateful for those who have worked so hard on that program to build it in the past and those who have stepped in to serve in the interim. I would love to expand this program, making it an inviting, exciting place where our children want to come and are enthusiastic about bringing their friends.

Christian parents are eager to pass their faith on to their children. Do you have a brief word of advice or encouragement?

I feel that honesty and vulnerability are the most important things to remember when trying to talk to your children about faith. While I grew up in a Christian home and was in church several times per week, I never got the sense that it was OK to question or to be honest about doubts or stumbles. We aren't perfect and never will be. Struggling with our faith, making mistakes—these are all things that we experience. If we aren't honest and open about that with our children, they may feel that they can't talk to us as they start to have their own questions. They may feel that they can't talk to us when they stumble. As the parent of an almost middle schooler, I grow in my own faith every time that she comes to me with a question, because I stop and reflect on things that I maybe haven't taken the time to reflect upon.

Who is your hero?

My hero is my mother. She always gave so much of herself to her children, and I am forever grateful for her dedication and love.

What is your favorite book?

I really love Jen Hatmaker and follow her on social media. She inspires me. A friend who lives in North Carolina mailed a copy of *7: An Experimental Mutiny Against Excess* to me, and it is a permanent fixture on my nightstand. I also love the classics and would love to take the time to reread some of those that I haven't touched since high school or college. I have always loved the book *I Know this Much is True* by Wally Lamb because I find it such a touching story about the love of family and mental illness. I also love a good suspenseful novel!


What is your favorite movie?
