Loving Your Prodigal by David C. Mauldin

Many believers know the pain of a grown child who rejects the gospel. Despite being taught the right things, going to church, and the example of Christian parents, the prodigal chooses the far country. Some prodigals grow up to be everything their parents could have wished, except they do not believe in Jesus Christ. Others both reject the gospel and choose a lifestyle at odds with biblical values. Still others choose a path of self-destruction—drugs, crime, etc. What's a Christian parent to do?

First, know that you are not alone. Man in the Mirror, a men's ministry, has gathered some alarming statistics about men in America. They report that 9 out of 10 men in church will have children who leave the church. If that figure is even close to accurate, you have lots of company.

Given the culture we live in, I am not surprised. Our children are bombarded every day with values and ideas that, if not examined, corrode faith. That's why we need to examine them and teach our children to also. We need to teach them to look for the angles. What's the message here? Who says so? And, why? Teach your children to be savvy about the hidden messages and values they consume.

Second, don't beat yourself up. You are not God, so you can't be a perfect parent. Even if you were a perfect parent, that's no guarantee your children would always choose the right path. Once they grow up, children become responsible for their own choices.

So long as your children are under your authority, you should be critical of yourself: Am I doing what I am supposed to? Am I living a worthy example? Do I talk with them about my faith? Do I answer their questions? Do I make sure they are in church? Do we pray as a family? Make every effort.

At some point, though, they become responsible for themselves. They make their own choices. That doesn't mean your job is over, but it does mean you are not in charge. That is the time to give yourself grace. You did the best you could, and no one could have reasonably asked for more. You laid a good foundation, but your child must build on it. You are not responsible for what is not in your control.



lay a new foundation, but you can be a positive witness in your child's life. Also, recognize that you have not put God in a hopeless situation. He is not sitting around wringing his hands, saying, "I was going to save that kid, but his mom and/or dad did such a poor job that now I am utterly helpless!"

Third, never give up. God works in people's lives in so many different, surprising ways. You never know what God might do. You must trust him and keep on praying. Never stop praying. I have heard of parents who prayed for years before their children came to faith. Some parents do not live to see the transformation God brings in answer to their prayers. But they will see it in eternity.


Fourth, maintain a good relationship with your prodigal. Billy Graham, who knew something about this, wrote, "Let them know you still love them, even if you don't approve of the way they are living. They know where you stand; you don't need to keep criticizing them or reminding them of what they should be doing. Remember the Bible's admonition: 'A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.' (Proverbs 15:1)."

You may have occasion to ask questions that will make them think. You may be able to point them to some sign of transcendence that will cause their heart or mind to open just a crack. Or maybe all you can do is love them. God set an example for Christian parents because he never gave up on his people. Complaining, rebellion, idolatry, and even terrible evil—we have done it all. God exhorted, he pleaded, he disciplined, but he never rejected us.

Ruth Bell Graham, Billy's wife, raised five children with him. She too knows all about this. She wrote a little poem:

I will— Encourage. Keep communications open at all times. Let them know they are loved and welcome at home, *always*. Permit the children to disagree with me, provided they do it respectfully. (And I find occasionally they are right and I am wrong). Make a clear distinction between moral and nonmoral issues. Encourage.


She offers this advice, "We mothers must take care of the possible and trust God for the impossible."

Seeking Allah, Finding Jesus Video Study develops in further detail the objections to Islam and case for Christianity that Qureshi introduced in Seeking Allah, Finding Jesus. When used with the accompanying Seeking Allah, Finding Jesus Study Guide, this accessible course is perfect for adult classes, small groups, segments in college or seminary courses, and motivated independent learners alike."
