A Praying Church By David C. Mauldin

E. M. Bounds inspires me to pray, but not the way he did. Bounds is a fascinating figure. He grew up in Missouri during the mid-19th century but spent his teens digging for gold in California. He did not strike it rich, so he returned to Missouri and studied law. At age 19 he became the youngest lawyer in the state. God, however, had other plans. God called Bounds to preach, so he closed his law office, went to seminary, and became a pastor.

I respect Bounds because he suffered greatly. When the Civil War broke out, he wanted to ride it out without taking sides. He opposed slavery, and his brothers were in the Union Army. But he served a church in the Methodist Episcopal Church South. He was arrested as a Southern sympathizer. He spent a year and a half in Federal prison before he was paroled in a prisoner exchange. Upon release, he was not allowed to take an oath of loyalty to the Union; instead, he was banished from his home state. He traveled south to Mississippi, where he Army as a chaplain. He was wounded at the Battle of Franklin and again taken prisoner. After the war, he returned to identify and properly bury the dead.

wife died after ten years of marriage. He also lost two children. A son by his first wife died at age 6. A son by his second wife died shortly after his first us a prayer theme for the month. They will also be birthday. These losses devastated Bounds.

Bounds was a man of prayer. He rose every day at 4:00 a.m. and prayed until 7:00 a.m. He wrote 9 books about prayer, and they are still in print today. We will read an excerpt from one of those books for Classics of Christian Spirituality on September 26.

Let's be honest: I am not going to be following his prayer schedule. Maybe you are not. But I am inspired by his firm conviction that prayer changes things. Prayer is power. The Bible vividly describes the power of prayer in the book of the Revelation:

And another angel came and stood at the altar with a golden censer, and he was given much incense to offer with the prayers of all the saints on the golden altar before the throne, and the smoke of the incense, with the prayers of the saints, rose before God from the hand of the angel. Then the angel took the censer and filled it with fire from the altar and threw it on the earth, and there were peals of thunder, rumblings, flashes of lightning, and an earthquake.

(Rev. 8:3-5 ESV)

Why Does Praying Seem So Hard?

-Susan Rosseau, Deacon Prayer Team Many Christians feel guilty that prayer is not more of a part of their spiritual lives. The good news is that prayer is not something to be checked off the to-do list! Why? Because prayer is an act of relationship that should be an open and ongoing dialogue. 1 Thes. 5:17 tells us to "pray continuously." But that is the hard part! To wake

One of my favorite TV personalities is talk show host Conan O'Brien.

If I told you I was friends with Conan O'Brien, you'd ask, "How often do you get to see him?"

If I answered, "I haven't met him yet, but I've watched his show every day and I've read a lot of articles about him," you'd say I was nuts. We can't know someone or have a real relationship without spending time together.

God wants a relationship with us. It's why He sent Jesus to die for our sins — so we can have a relationship again.

Why do Christians pray? We grow our relationship with God through reading the Bible and prayer. Reading the Bible is how we hear from God, and prayer is how we speak to Him in return. This process of talking to God, listening for His voice and reading His Word is how we spend quality time with our Heavenly Father.

Only reading the Bible doesn't give me a relationship with God. People who don't believe in God have read the Bible. Some atheists can quote the Bible better than some Christians, but they don't have a relationship with God. Prayer is an integral part of gaining a relationship with God, because prayer turns one-way research into two-way communication. up in the morning and say "I will be in a permanent conversation with God today" is one thing—to do it is another. A flourishing prayer life comes from the overflow of a heart totally and fully in love with God.

In searching for articles that I felt would be encouraging to PCPC, I came across the following article written by Jason Farr, courtesy of NewSpring Church.

4 Things That Happen When We Pray

1. Closeness (Jeremiah 33:2-3)

Prayer is intimate and personal. When Christians pray to Jesus, sharing with Him on a personal level helps us to trust Him more.

2. Peace of Mind (Philippians 4:7)

We can get bogged down by the negative thoughts in our heads. When we take our worry and doubt to God in prayer, we gain insight to overcome our negative thoughts. When we pray, with thanksgiving and petition, God gives us peace unlike anything we can imagine.

3. Guidance (Romans 8:26)

We don't always know what to pray for when we pray, but God does. Romans 8:26 says, "...the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us..." When we humbly seek God, the Holy Spirit expresses in prayer what we can't articulate in words.

4. Healing (James 5:16)

God heals us as we pray for ourselves and each other. Trying to fix our problems ourselves is a fruitless effort, so we take them to the One who can. God created the universe and everything in it. Help is waiting for us if we'll humble ourselves and ask for it.

The Deacon Prayer Team is praying for the people of PCPC, asking that our prayer lives become more meaningful and fulfilling and an active part of our spiritual lives.

hosting a prayer breakfast next month (October). It will be an exciting mix of food, prayer, and hearing inspiring stories.

Three of our Classics of Christian Spirituality readings focused on prayer. John Calvin gave us practical teaching on how to pray. Jonathan Edwards enticed us with the possibility of sweet communion with the Lord. And, Bounds urged us to pray with our whole self.

Next month our sermon series will address some unusual aspects of prayer. One sermon will be about how to pray your longing. How do you pour out the deep desires of your heart to God? Another will be about praying your frustration with how the world is.

We are talking a lot about prayer. But are we praying? What makes us a praying church is your prayer. How much time do you set aside for intentional prayer? How is that working for you? If you are not satisfied with your practice of prayer or you are not satisfied with your life generally what are you going to do about it?

Bounds taught one of his sons the power of prayer by example. Bounds had been invited to preach at a church in Chicago. It was a series of evangelistic meetings. He felt God wanted him to go, but he did not have the money for the trip. He packed his bags and took his son along. They got on the train, and the conductor recognized him. He said, "Rev. Bounds, you don't have enough money for your fare. I'll have to put you out along the way." Bounds said, "Well, take us as far as this will pay." The conductor said, "But I'll have to put you out in a field somewhere." Bounds said, "That's alright. The Lord will provide." (Bounds never had had much money and never cared to. He trusted the Lord for his needs.) His son was worried. A while later the conductor came in and said, "A man in the next car saw you get on board. He recognized you. He said he wanted to pay for your ticket. He's paid for you both all the way to Chicago."

Prayer changes things. Prayer is power.

First, we made a decision to move middle school youth group to Wednesday nights, starting August 22, 5:30-7pm.



Rock the Universe: September 7-9, 2018 Florida's Biggest Christian Music Festival





Adult Sunday School:


Sunday mornings at 9:45 a.m. in Langill Hall beginning September 2nd.
