

A Warning and a Promise by David C. Mauldin



As you enter the Sanctuary, you will notice something new. Beside the back entrance, a sculpture greets worshippers with a warning and a promise. The sculpture is called "On

the Road to Damascus." It was commissioned by Joe Kordick and created by Bill Bond in 1986. It has been given to PCPC by Phyllis Kordick in memory of Joe.

As the name indicates, it depicts Saul of Tarsus at the moment Jesus appeared to him on the road to Damascus. If you are unfamiliar with the story, you can read it in Acts 9. In the earliest days of the church, Saul persecuted Christians. His goal was to smother Christianity in its cradle. As he traveled to Damascus to deal with believers there, Jesus appeared to him. Naturally, Saul became a believer, and using the Greek form of his name (Paul), went on to become a great apostle and author of about a quarter of the New Testament.

So why this statue? And why place it where it is? You will notice Saul, with a look of terror on his face, is facing the Sanctuary. This placement is intentional. As I said, it communicates a warning and a promise. When you enter the Sanctuary, you should expect an encounter with Jesus. You are not there to be entertained. Worship is not merely a quiet hour of refuge from the frantic demands of another week. You enter that room to encounter Jesus. He has called you there. He is expecting you. You should be expecting him. Too often, of course, you are not. You either fail to notice him, or he takes you by surprise.

Jesus loves to take people by surprise. Ask Saul. He was not expecting his encounter. In worship, you should expect the unexpected. God will not always follow our script. And yet, unlike Saul, you have some idea what you are letting yourself in for. An encounter with the Living God can be frightening, beautiful, or both at once. Kierkegaard said that worship is a performance, but not in the way most people think. Some vainly imagine that the pastors, praise band or choir, and other worship leaders are performing for the congregation. This is not true. Instead, the entire congregation is performing for God. The pastors, band, and other leaders provide directions and cues. You are front and center. God is the audience.

I like that. I find it helpful. It falls short in one respect, however. God plays a more active role in worship than the theater analogy indicates. In fact, God does more than we do. He allows us to enter his presence. He empowers our praise. He hears our prayers. He speaks his Word. He convicts and comforts us. He brings us to faith. He gives himself to us. He claims us as his own. This is why you should come to worship, expecting to encounter the Lord. We have our plan, but he has his. You do not know what he might do.

When we gather for worship, the space we inhabit is not like any other space—even if it is a gym. The time of worship is not like any other time. Yes, all of life is holy, every hour, every place. But they are holy because Jesus inhabits them and because we set aside certain times and places just for him. Special times of worship render all of life holy. Without them, all of life becomes unholy. Therefore, when we worship, we are on holy ground. We ought to be aware of that. We stand before the Almighty, the Holy One of Israel. We ought to consider that. We can worship at all because of the grace he has given us through his Son, our Living Savior, Jesus Christ.

When we worship, our Living Savior is with us through his Holy Spirit. This is the warning and promise of the statue. You are about to encounter the risen Lord. Beware! He will change you. He will demand you surrender everything. Yet, he is gentle and humble. He will give you rest—and the promise of eternal life. He will make you glorious, as he is.

Youth News October 2019 by Jason Pridmore

Hurricane Dorian:



Hurricane Dorian hit the Atlantic this past month as the second strongest hurricane recorded in modern history and slammed into the Bahamas, leaving devastation in its wake. As the needs of the Bahamas began

to surface, people all along the Treasure Coast began to jump into action. Palm City Presbyterian Church was no exception. Led by our youth, partnering with United Servants Abroad [Don Elmore's ministry—a supported missionary of our congregation], the generosity of our church and community once again proved to be overwhelming. With little notice but with big heartsin the course of a week—PCPC collected over 400 lbs. of food, clothes, toiletries, paper goods, water filtration systems, flashlights, bedding, tents, and first aid kits. The items were categorized, boxed, labeled, weighed and delivered to the North County Airport to be loaded onto a plane (flown by King's Wings) and delivered to Eleuthera and the Abaco Islands. The goods would then be dispersed through United Servants Abroad and the local churches, getting necessary items to those most in need.

In addition to the goods and materials, PCPC raised over \$22,000 to help aid missions and Christian organizations directly doing relief work in the Bahamas. Donated money went directly to fund fuel and flights to the islands, as well as purchase items of need as the situation in the islands continues to change. We are so proud of our youth and grateful to a congregation who generously gives to those in need, exemplifying Jesus' command to "love [our] neighbors." Thank you to all who donated and helped support the Bahamas and to those working directly with people impacted by Hurricane Dorian.

*At this time, PCPC is no longer collecting material goods for the Bahamas. We are still collecting monetary donations so that the organizations on the ground in the

Bahamas can directly buy the items they feel are needed. Checks can be made out to Palm City Presbyterian Church and turned in to the church office. Donations can also be made online through our website.

More Good News about ECO

The Presbytery of Florida met September 20-21 at the Canterbury Conference Center near Orlando, giving us more reasons to be thankful we are part of ECO. PCPC sent a strong delegation: Elders Pat Douglas, Ruthann Hewson, and Rob Johnson, plus Pastors Brad Klostreich and David Mauldin.

The guest speaker was the Rev. Dr. Greg Wagenfuhr. Dr. Wagenfuhr has a Ph.D. in Theology and Religious Studies from the University of Bristol (UK). He currently serves as the chair of ECO's Theology Team. He is also a church planter in Cañon City, Colorado. Cañon City is not a resort town. The primary industry there is prisons, and there are 14 in the area. Dr. Wagenfuhr's wife works in a ministry that provides foster care to children of incarcerated women. I am pleased to see the person guiding our Theology Team is a church planter who works on the frontlines of ministry. I see that as an advantage for us.



Dr. Wagenfuhr gave us an update on our confessions. In 2016, the synod approved ECO's Confessional Standards. These are the Nicene Creed, the Apostles' Creed, the Heidelberg Catechism, the Westminster Standards, and the Theological Declaration of Barmen. (You can download it free from https://www.eco-pres.org/static/media/ uploads/confesstds.online.07.08.19.pdf.) He told us a revision is coming soon that will standardize and modernize some language, but he promised nothing controversial. Synod

has also requested a new document from ECO. They are not calling it a confession. They are not sure how it will fit into the Confessional Standards. They hope it will give leadership to the larger evangelical world. The goal is to present it to the synod in 2022. It is in the early stages of development.

At the presbytery meeting, we approved a new Manual of Operations for our presbytery. The good news here is, we are keeping the presbytery lean. In ECO, we do not waste time and money on bureaucracy. Churches do ministry. The presbytery supports churches. The presbytery has just enough

structure to provide essential services to churches, such as approving and overseeing pastors, providing oversight and guidance to sessions, and preparing candidates for ministry.

ECO is a new movement. We remain committed to the truth of scripture and to serving others in Jesus' name together.

Greetings from the Mission Committee!

Wow, what a couple of months we have had! We are so very blessed at PCPC...Hurricane Dorian didn't leave a footprint in our town but led us to pray, think, and help.

BAHAMAS RELIEF

Our brothers and sisters in the Bahamas continue to be in great need, and we at PCPC are again blessed to be able to help. The congregation gave over \$22,000.00 and contributed hundreds of pounds of goods which were collected and sorted by the youth of the church. We can feel good about our outpouring of generosity because

one of the missionaries PCPC supports, Don Elmore, is directly connected to the Bahamas. Over the years, many in the congregation, including myself, have gone on mission trips to the Bahamas with Don. The Jordan Stone Mission House, which we helped build on Eleuthera, is being used to house many from outlying islands made homeless by the storm's devastation.

The water filtration equipment purchased will filter water at a rate of 50 gallons per hour. At last count, we delivered 25 of those filtration kits to the hardest-hit areas. It is difficult for me to imagine living on an island with water all around that I can't drink, cook with, or even wash in until it is filtered.

The supplies the congregation brought to church have already been sent over to the islands. Don will let us know if he needs to ask us for additional aid since their problems are not going away anytime soon. Blessings go out to Don Elmore, Jason Pridmore, and Bernie Kerr for stepping up immediately after the storm. They made sure our gifts went directly to the islands where Bahamians would receive relief as soon as our airplanes could land. Giving, helping, and praying is definitely what the Bible teaches and the thing to do. Thank you for your contributions.

PCPC MISSIONS VIDEO

Over the summer, committee members Diana Rew and Gretchen Dewey took the vision of PCPC Missions and wrote, directed and produced a professional video that highlights the work we do on the church's behalf. We will

be sharing this special video presentation with the congregation soon. Thank you to Sam Johnson, who used his drone flying skills to capture some beautiful footage for us. Special thanks to Ed Blakely, our professional videographer, who expertly filmed and edited the video clips. He created an outstanding production which will both inform and delight our congregation.

GOD'S LOVE. We've all experienced it in some way, or hopefully, we have! But how much do we understand about all of the marvelous ways God loves us? Lauren Chandler learned more about all the ways God loves us during her husband Matt's struggle with cancer in 2011. In 2016 she published *Steadfast Love*. The book breaks down a verse that became ever-present in the Chandlers' lives during their cancer struggle. Sit down and learn about God's steadfast love from Psalm 107. Lauren does a fabulous job of not only explaining the verse but showing us God's different ways of loving us. She uses many familiar Bible stories to help us understand the "hesed" love or unconditional love that we see throughout the Bible. We learn more about the way God loved Adam & Eve, Joseph, Job, Jonah, the disciples, and Jesus.
